



**TOWN OF SPIDER LAKE, SAWYER CO, WI
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING 6-8-2005**

The regular monthly meeting of the Town of Spider Lake Board of Supervisors was called to order on June 8, 2005 by Chairman Krause. Present was Krause, King, Brandt, Promersberger, Overman, Zoning Administrator Boss, Treasurer J. Brandt and Clerk Guyer.

The minutes were reviewed by the Board. Motion to approve was made by Overman with one correction, that being in the Town Board of Supervisors meeting minutes it states "King stated he has received insurance from Cable Area Bike Race", it should read "King stated he has received insurance information FROM Cable Area Bike Race. Motion seconded by Promersberger, all in favor, motion carried.

The Treasurers report was given and made part of the minutes. Balance on hand 5/31/05 \$288,099.35. Fire Department Capitol Outlay, holding tanks and Delinquent Personal Property Tax remain the same. Delinquent Personal Property Taxes have been charged back to the Schools, County and State. Motion to approve the report was made by King and seconded by Promersberger. All in favor, motion carried.

The Bids for Road equipment were opened for a Motor Grader and Rubber Tire End Loader and were as follows:

Fabco – Cat Total \$177,623.00
Nortrax \$164,000.00

The Road Committee will meet on June 2, 2005 at 6:30 to review the bids and made recommendation to the Board.

The Town Board will meet on 6/29/05 at 6:30 PM to approve the Liquor License for Deanna Grajek.

Overman stated the results of the Planning Committee Meeting of 5/25/05 was the Committee approved the CSM for Vesel and the recommendation from the Planning Committee for their meeting at 6:30 on this date was: CSM for Janeczko on Upper A, Gov't Lot 3 in Sec. 34-42-7. They wish to separate one parcel into two lots. Motion was made to approve the CSM as long as the back lot does not have access to the lake.

Approved the CSM for Woods located in Part of NW 1/4 Sec. 21-42-6. There is one 50' lot and 1-100' lot creating a 105' nonconforming but buildable lot because the lots were created before Zoning.

Condominium Mitigation was discussed. Boss will enforce 70-30 until the ordinance is changed. Nonconforming structures created after 1967 with less than 200' of frontage cannot place an addition over 50% one time.

Motion was made by Brandt and seconded by Promersberger to approve the recommendations of the Planning Committee. All in favor motion carried.

The Boating Survey sent out by the Town was given by Alcoe and the results of the survey sent out to Spider Lake Property Owners only were given, much discussion was held. Results were as follows:

1. Are you in favor of Spider Lake Township hiring a boating safety patrol officer?

29 (47%) Yes 146 (53%) No

2. Are you in favor of retaining the current regulations that limit water skiing to the hours of 11 AM to 3 PM on Ghost, Spider Lake Chain and Lower Clam lakes?

220 (81%) Yes 50 (19%) No (refer to 3.)

3. If no, what hours would you recommend? Less than 15 respondents with multiple suggestions.

4. Are you in favor of limiting the hours of operation for Personal Water Craft on applicable lakes to the same time slot as water skiing?

229 (85%) Yes 39 (15%) No

5. Are you in favor of retaining the 10 MPR speed limit?

153 (56%) Yes

120 (44%) No (refer to 6.)

6. If no, what would you recommend?

34 (25%) 20 MPH

19 (14%) 25 MPH

81 (61%) Speed sufficient for watercraft obtain "plane"

7. Would you be in favor of Spider Lake Township holding a referendum on these issues?

87 (32%) Yes, Binding Referendum

31 (11%) Yes, Non-Binding Referendum

155 (57%) No Referendum

8. Are you eligible to vote in Spider Lake Township?

134 (47%) Yes

150 (53%) No

9. Are you a lakeshore property owner in Spider Lake Township?

While this question was not tabulated it is estimated that over 98% of the respondents were lake shore property owners'.

*Percentages are representative of the respondents for that particular question.

Krause stated the Recommendation of the ATV Committee meeting was to hold a Public Hearing to add to the roads allowed for ATV's the following: Janet Rd from Lenroot Town Line to Bodecker Rd. 36 miles, Bodecker Rd from Lenroot Town Line to Janet Rd intersection .19 miles and Telemark Rd from Bayfield County Line to Camp #38 Rd .5 miles. Public Hearing to be held June 29, 2005 at 6:45 P.M.

Krause stated that on Dick-Sy Road where the Snowmobile trail was put in, no permits were issued. A motion was made by Promersberger and seconded by King for the Town to send out a letter to clean up the trees on the Town and State Right-a-way and reseed the area. The responsible person to have 30 days to clean up the trees and mess. All in favor, motion carried.

The Payroll vouchers were presented for payment, 14376-14387 in the amount of \$5,942.79. Motion to approve was made by Brandt, seconded by Promersberger. All in favor, motion carried. General vouchers # 14388-14403 in the amount of \$9,775.63 were presented for payment. Motion to approve was made by King, seconded by Promersberger. All in favor, motion carried.

Brandt stated there will be a clean up for Hazardous Waste on July in Winter, Round Lake and Stone Lake and again Saturday August 6th in Hayward. He will work on a date for a clean up date for the Town of Spider Lake.

Promersberger stated the Fire Department letters for the picnic have been sent out. Cash on Hand \$10,000.30, Training has been completed. Como did the safety check and the heating unit was out in Station #2, the Town Hall septic didn't need pumping, the gutters have been fixed at the Town Hall and the doors painted and she has posted the required signs in the Town Garage.

Krause stated the contract has been let for asphaltting and milling. Work should be done the first week in July. Culverts are being put in on Upper A, there was a broken window of the tractor mower when it was parked by the Garage and the road crew will be doing grading of the roads.

Overman stated a faucet for filtered water should be put on the back of the Town Hall and she would like to have a representative from Jump River talk to the Board about their cutting trees, John Donner will be contacted.

The results of the Room Tax Survey sent out was given with 3 in favor, 19 against, 16 did not reply and 3 were undeliverable. Krause recommended the Town drop the Room Tax issue. Motion was made by Promersberger to forget about the Room Tax, seconded by King. All in favor, motion carried.

The Clerk presented the following Liquor/Beer/Operator and Cigarette licenses for approval with the exception of Deanna Grajek whose application was not received 15 days prior to the meeting:
