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**TOWN OF SPIDER LAKE, SAWYER CO, WI  
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING 8-3-2005**

The Town Board of Supervisors meeting was called to order on August 3, 2005 at 6:25 P.M. by acting Chairman Brandt. Present was King, Brandt, Promersberger, Overman, Zoning Administrator Boss and Clerk Guyer. Absent was Krause.

Overman stated the recommendation from the Planning Committee was to issue a Conditional Use Permit to Susan Gorski for Gov't lot 3, Sec. 22, T42N, R7W Zoned RR-1, 12.1 acres for grading over 10,000 sq. ft. which will allow drainage away from the lake instead of toward the lake. Motion was made by Promersberger to grant the CUP for Gorski with the conditions as set by the DNR and also by the Town of Spider Lake Zoning Ord. Pg. 24, par #4 which A,B,C,E, & F apply. Motion seconded by King. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion was made by Promersberger and seconded by King to grant the Zoning request for Topp and Petri. Topp transferred a parcel of land to Petrie Disc Pcl. in SW 1/4-SW 1/4 Sec. 29, T42N, R7W, 18,596 sq. ft., 0.43 acres, Vol 451, Page 499, Zoned A-1 requests change to RR-1, and the request from Mike Petrie, Petrie transferred a parcel of land to Topp Disc. Pcl. In SW 1/4-SW 1/4 Sec. 29, T42N, R7W, 18,911 sq. ft., 0.43 acres, Document # Deed 321029, Zoned RR-1 requests change to A-1. Reason was because a garage owned by Petrie was found to be on Topp's property, request is to match the zoning of exchanged property. All in favor, motion carried.

The Clerk explained the letter received from the Governors office regarding the Rustic Road Photo contest which stated a photo taken on a Rustic Road in Spider Lake Township was one of the top winners in the contest and invited two representatives from the Town to be present on August 16, 2005 to attend a special reception to recognize contest winners at the Governor's Executive Residence in Madison. Motion was made by Overman and seconded by Promersberger to authorize two representatives to attend.

Motion to adjourn was made by Overman, seconded by King. All in favor, motion carried.
